If you have any questions, concerns, or ideas; call the office to arrange a meeting with me or any member of the faculty and staff. We are here to help and learn together.

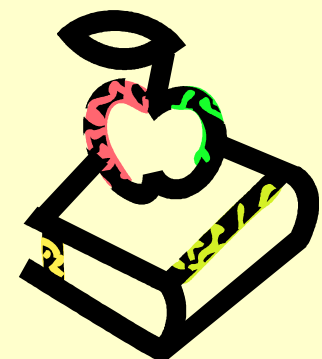

Wednesday, August 20th is peeking around the corner, and some of us may be having different thoughts and feeling about the first day! I understand that this may be a big transition for some children and their families. As parents you can support by being relaxed and confident about school and your child will follow your lead.

A main focus during the first couple weeks of school will be discovering, learning and getting comfortable in our classroom and with each other. I am excited for us to become a learning community and a school family. We will practice, practice, and practice school routines both in and out of our classroom. I will do my very best to facilitate your child towards their independence and I am so honored and excited to be your child's teacher.

This following supply list was sent in the postal patron and you may have picked it up at school, but I wanted to ensure that you and your child have this, as it will help us have a successful year. There are a couple of items that will need labeled with your child's name to help with organization. Should you have any questions about anything, please feel free to call me at 776-2299.

- 3 boxes of 24 count crayons
- 24 **plain** wooden pencils
- 1 pair of blunt tip scissors
- 4 bottles of Elmer's white glue
- 24 glue sticks
- 2 bottles of liquid hand soap
- 1 box of tissues
- 1 box of band-aides
- 1 containers of baby wipes
- 8 boxes of snacks
- Gym shoes, non-marking and velcro style (if they do not know how to tie shoes yet)
- Complete set of extra clothes (send in a grocery bag with name on the bag)
- Large backpack that will hold a three ring binder (put name on the backpack)
- Paint shirt (put name on it)
- 1 pencil box (put name on it)
- 2 pictures of family and or friends for our Family and Friends Board (**Please mail to Mrs. Prevost in the provided envelop before school starts, so I can have our board ready the first day.**)
- **Register for Kindergarten as soon as you can, even if your child was in preschool, so we can ensure we have an accurate list.**



As part of our daily schedule, for the first half of the year, we will be having 30 minutes of quiet time. I have individual mats for your child to lie on and it would be nice for them to have **1 small blanket** not any bigger than 4x4 and **1 small stuffed animal** not any bigger than a football. Please note the blanket and stuffed animal will be left at school. I will take care of washing the blankets every Friday. Please write your child's name on the blanket and stuffed animal.

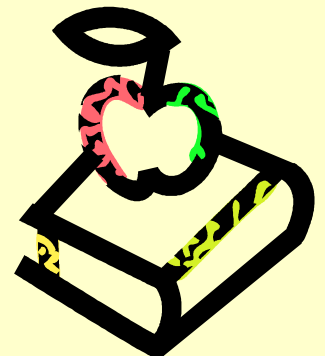
