Dear First Grade Families,

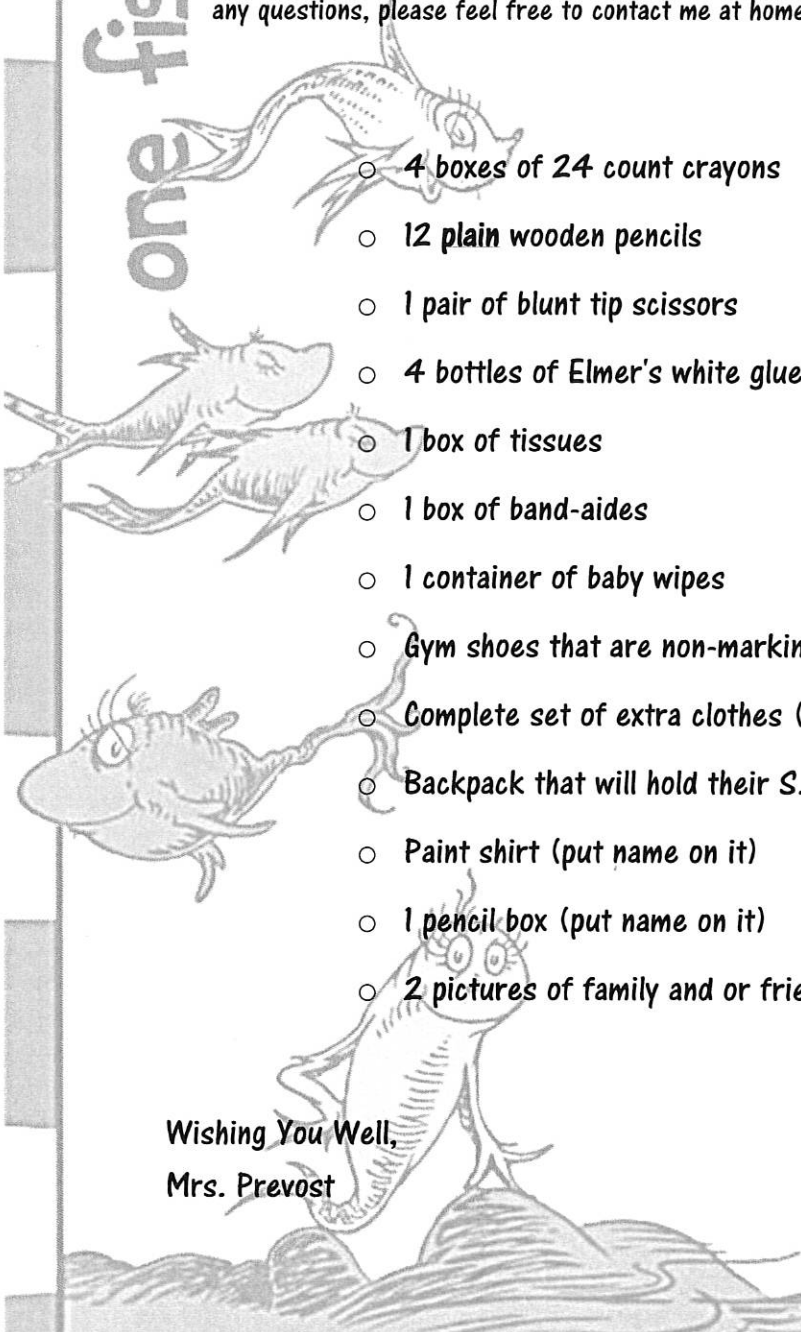

 - If your child had some last year, they are at the school and they do not need another pack.

High School-Elements & Principles of Art

- Must Have:
 - 1-2" 3-Ring Binder
 - You may reuse the one from last year as this is your Art Rubric Portfolio
 - If students plan on being in art classes all through high school, I recommend that you invest in a 2"-3" binder that can be used all four years.
 - 8-12 tab dividers for their binder
 - This will help them keep their Rubrics separated by course.
 - They will need at least 8 if they just take the high school art courses, but if they take Theatrical Art courses too, they will need more.
 - Mechanical Pencils & Lead for art tote
- Recommendation:
 - Colorful Sharpies
 - Fine Tip and/or Ultra-Fine Tip

High School-Musical Theatre Arts

- Must Have:
 - A 100 page or more Notebook
 - 1-2" 3-Ring Binder
 - High School Art Students can use their Art Binder for this too.
 - White Cotton or Canvas Shoes in Student's Size
 - They can be slip-ons, laced, high-tops or etc. As long as the student likes the style of the shoe and it is white COTTON or CANVAS.
 - Wal-Mart, Target, and Payless stores usually have affordable options to choose from.
