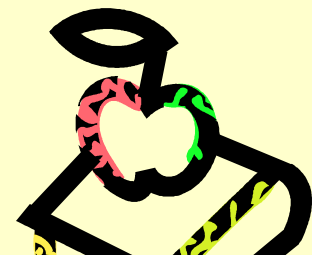
Amber Henwood – History

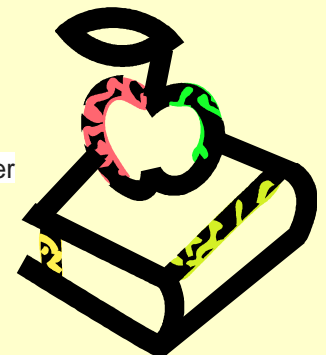
