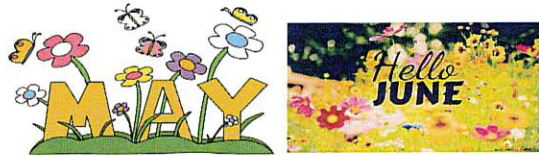

#### General Information Update:

- The Board of Trustees and administration want to thank Mrs. Mindt, our fifth-grade teacher, for her year of teaching service at Savage. She will be missed! Fairview is gaining a wonderful asset to their system. With the acceptance of her resignation on March 7, 2022 at a special board meeting, the Board of Trustees also made the decision to restructure our fifth and sixth grade classroom model, for financial purposes.
    - Our sixth-grade students will have a flexible middle/elementary school schedule, with science, math, history, band, and art being instructed by our certified 5-12 teachers. While language arts and homeroom will be taught by the fifth-grade teacher, during the time the fifth graders receive their daily art and music.
    - School Board :
  - April 25, 2022: A “Special” board meeting is scheduled at 7:00 PM in the Boardroom to open bids for our water construction.
  - May 3, 2022: School Election will be held in the Commons from 12:00-8:00 PM for the purpose of voting on electing one trustee for a three position, Wayne Quinnell is the only candidate that filed. In addition, the public will vote on the increase of the Elementary General Fund by \$3800.92 or approximately 1.67 mills pending new year taxable value.

- Not Required, but if your student finds a set of stickers that matches the scrapbook paper and washi tape, that will come in handy too.
- Also, a sticker set of alphabet letters that match the paper and washi tape could come in handy for your student.

#### 8<sup>th</sup> Grade

- 24 or 50 Count Colored Pencils (8<sup>th</sup> graders should already have a set in the art room.)
- New students will need a 1.5" or 2" binder to keep in the art room
- Empty Cereal Box

### High School – Mastering the Mediums (Fall Studio)

- 50 or 100 Count Colored Pencils (some students already have these, you do not need to purchase new ones)
  - Crayola, Prismacolor, or Arteza are best.
    - Roseart, Prang, and cheaper brands **DO NOT WORK** for this unit.
- 4 or 5, 2 oz. Acrylic Paints (These colors can be whatever colors they want; they just have to look good together as they will be used on the same project. Example: turquoise, purple, ivory, and magenta. Or orange, yellow, red, and white. It could even be lavender, purple, pinkish-purple, and bubble gum.)

- I recommend FolkArt or DecoArt brands. Please get them from a hobby supply store as they should be around \$2.00 a piece or less when on sale. Amazon's prices are WAY too high!!!!
  - Craftsmart acrylics tend to be too chalky and thin.

### **High School – Artistic Interpretation (Spring)**

- Students who take this class will be provided with anything that is in the room to use. However, depending on the projects that they choose to create, may need some special materials that they will need to provide for themselves. Do not feel like you have to purchase anything and everything they request.

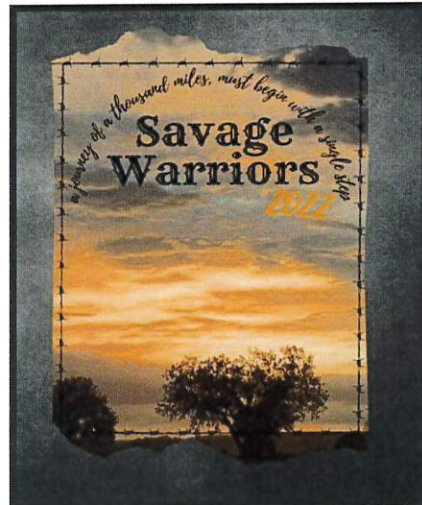
