The sixth grade is finishing up their lessons in physical science, acids and bases here we come. Indicator magic is on the horizon. The seventh graders just finished building their "Imaginary Angiosperms" and are now learning about the state flower, the Bitterroot. Their models will be on display at the Spring Extravaganza. The eighth grade is finishing their book and building paper roller coasters to display. They are integrating their knowledge of Newton's laws, gravity, velocity, acceleration and friction to build amazing structures. 




