New Policy for Ineligible Students

This year we will be implementing a mandatory Study Session for ineligible student(s). If the student does not raise their grade during the granted grace week, they then become ineligible. The student(s) will then report to the weekly assigned teacher Monday-Friday, including game days, for 30 minutes. The student(s) will call you on Monday when they become ineligible.

Cell Policy Revised

Possession and use of cellular phones, pagers, iPods and all electronic devices on school grounds, at school-sponsored activities, and while under the supervision and control of District employees is a privilege which will be permitted only under the circumstances described herein. At no time will any person operate a cell phone or other electronic device with video capabilities in a locker room, bathroom, or other location where such operation may violate the privacy right of another person. Any student found to be guilty of taking pictures deemed inappropriate or using their cell phones inappropriately (i.e. cyber bullying) will be subject to disciplinary action in-

cluding suspension and / or expulsion.

Students may use cellular phones, iPods, pagers and other electronic devices on school grounds before school begins and after school ends. Students in grades 6-12 may also use such devices during the scheduled lunch period for all students. These devices must be kept out of sight and in silent mode during the instructional day unless given special permission by a staff member to be used for educational purposes only. Unauthorized use of such devices disrupts the instructional program and distracts from the learning environment. Therefore, unauthorized use is grounds for confiscation of the device by the school

officials, including classroom teachers. Confiscated devices will be returned under the following conditions:

1st offense: Warning to the student and returned at the end of the day.

2nd offense: 30 minutes of detention and phone returned at the end of the day.

3rd offense: 1 hour of detention served over 2 days and parent must remove the phone.

Successive offenses: At discretion of administration.
