Welcome to a new year! As always, it is so good to see the students excited to be one year older and experience a new grade level. The teachers made certain that the opening days were smooth and easy to navigate. All students received a new handbook and met with Mrs. Nelson or me to discuss any new policies that will be implemented this year. Mrs. Nelson will also be principal this year and Sarah Tuttle is our counselor. I am looking forward to working with the two of them to ensure student progress in Savage School.

One of our goals this year is to increase communication with parents in a timely, efficient manner. Each family should have received a letter discussing Alert Solutions. This program works with our Student Information System (SIS) to alert parents to emergency situations such as school snow days, early outs, buses not running, or buses leaving early. The message will go directly to the device of your choice such as a text message, email, and or home message. You can also pick all three choices. The earlier you turn in this information, the sooner you can be informed about what is happening at school.

Another new protocol will be arriving in September that will increase the safety of the students and staff at the school. All doors will be locked 24 hours a day. The new system will include a buzzer that is connected to the office with a monitor showing who is at the door. The office will unlock the door for the person buzzing for admission. This does reduce the convenience for parents, delivery people, and workman when it comes to entering the school, but the safety of the students will always come first with the faculty, staff, administration, and Board of Trustees. I thank you for understanding this necessary change to the traditional open door policy of the past.

So buckle up for the year, come to our activities, and **celebrate all that is Savage!**

Homecoming Week Set for 19-24

Dress-up days, a parade, a bonfire, sporting events, and a coronation are all set for September 19-24, as Savage gets set to celebrate Homecoming.

The week will begin a bit differently this year. The traditional Coronation and bonfire will take place at 7:00 on Monday evening. This will allow the school to honor the King and Queen all throughout Homecoming week.

The weeklong celebration will feature the following dress-up days:

Monday: Wrangle the Mustangs/Longhorns Day: Western Attire Day.

Tuesday: Twinning Tuesday, dress the same as a friend.

Wednesday: Workout

Wednesday: Wear exercise clothes.

On Friday, there will be a parade down Main Street beginning at 2:00.

The Senior Class will have their traditional pre-game tailgate fundraiser prior to the football game on Friday.

Savage to no longer sell season tickets

Due to the ever-increasing costs of maintaining a quality athletic program, Savage will no longer be selling season tickets. There are a number of factors that contributed to this decision. The major cost to the athletic fund is paying the game officials. The available pool of officials is shrinking and we have to hire from areas that require travel, which is an added cost. We paid over \$10,000 in official fees last year. The gate at each game does not always cover those fees. The athletic fund also pays out for new equipment in football, volleyball, basketball, and track. This includes new uniforms at all grade levels. The fund also covers food, lodging, and travel when teams are required to stay over night. It cost the district over \$3,000 dollars to send our track team to the state meet last year. We are grateful to our constant, loyal fans who know that we want to present our teams in the best possible manner.

should make it easier to organize assignments and communicate with students.


I'm also very excited to be teaching a Science Fiction Literature class. I have five students in that class that are learning about that genre and how it asks big questions of who we are as a society and species.
